CMHC research found that housing starts across the country reached a SAAR (Seasonally Adjusted Annual Rate) of 245,657 in June, 26% higher than May's 196,809 units.

Poor housing conditions including issues such as mould, safety, crowding, and unaffordability, have been associated with a wide range of health conditions among adults: chronic diseases

Chronic housing needs have been directly linked to severe respiratory tract infections in children, suicide, low high school graduation rates, family violence, and addiction, the rates of which are higher in the North than elsewhere in Canada. In addition to housing being a critical determinant of health, chronic housing need continues to deny many northern and Indigenous people the opportunity to engage equally in community, society, and politics.

Average Rent in Canada. According to PadMapper.com, Windsor, when compared to 24 metropolitan areas across the country, was found to have the lowest rental rates in Canada. The minimum house rent in Windsor, based on a median monthly rate, was 750 CAD (564 USD) for a one-bedroom and 990 CAD (745 USD) for a two-bedroom.

According to the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC), a household is living in acceptable housing when it is: adequate (does not need major repairs) suitable (has enough bedrooms for the household), and affordable (costs less than 30% of before-tax income)

Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC) considers a household to be in "core housing need if its housing: falls below at least one of the adequacy, affordability or suitability standards and would have to spend 30% or more of its total before-tax income to pay the median rent of alternative local housing that is acceptable (meets all three housing standards)(CMHC, 2012)."

Based on data from Statistics Canada's 2016 Canadian Income Survey, 1.6 million urban households, or 13.6% of all Canadian households living in urban areas, were in core housing need in 2016. This proportion was similar to that in 2015. In 2016, Ontario was the province with the highest proportion of urban households in core housing need.

About 11% of Canadian households are in core housing need, with affordability being the single greatest contributor. The proportion of people in core housing need, however, varies by region and population, with greatest concern associated with those living in the North, Indigenous communities, and major urban centres such as Toronto and Vancouver.
