Outcome Based Assessment

is repeated, outcomes-based assessment assists faculty, administration, and staff in making informed decisions about their respective areas. Assessment is not the same as evaluation. Assessment seeks to improve the quality of performance regardless of its current level, whereas evaluation measures performance by judging quality against a standard.

Outcomes-based assessment is the deliberate collection of evidence of student learning based on outcomes. It yields a mark relative to the outcomes (criterion referenced) rather than other students. What do you do differently in an outcomes-based system?

Outcomes-Based Assessment (OBA) is a two-stage assessment process: Stage one – It is a cognitive assessment consisting of computer-based multiple-choice question exam (MCQ) and an objective structured clinical exam. This stage must be complete before IQNMs can move to the second stage of the assessment.

Definition of Outcomes Assessment

Outcome-based education or outcomes-based education (OBE), also known as standards-based education, is an educational theory that bases each part of an educational system around goals (outcomes). By the end of the educational experience, each student should have achieved the goal. There is no single specified style of teaching or assessment in OBE; instead, classes, opportunities, and assessments should all help students achieve the specified outcomes.

We can also offer an outcomes-focussed assessment. This we would do in partnership with people, their carers and their families. We call this process Personal Outcome Planning. The assessment process takes an assets-based approach which means that we will talk with you and focus on your strengths and abilities in order that together we can build on these.

Outcomes-Focussed Assessments

Assessment of outcomes is done using authentic assessment tools. Battersby states: " Key to the outcomes approach [in BC] is an approach to assessment that emphasizes ' authentic assessment ' ...[i.e.] creating assignments that stimulate as much as possible the [real-life outside-of-class] situations in which students would make use of the knowledge, skills and values emphasized in the course " (as cited in PDP 3210 Curriculum Development Course Guide August, 2013, page 47). Outcomes based assessment focusses on providing students with multiple opportunities to practice what they need to do, and the provision of feedback on that practice (formative). Eventually, students must demonstrate achievement (summative). We should only assign marks when we evaluate performance against the course outcomes.

Example: An Outcome-based Assessment Marking Scheme Defining Curriculum Objective and Intended Learning Outcomes (ILO) A learning outcome is what a student CAN DO as a result of a learning experience. It describes a specific task that he/she is able to perform at a given level of competence under a certain situation.

Characteristics of outcomes based assessment

The outcomes based approach works best for tasks or knowledge that are easily measured, such as whether someone can drive a forklift, rather than other topics where it's more speculative or subjective and therefore harder to measure, such as whether someone is able to write good music. The obvious issue in this example is defining 'good'.
